Pray for Kian Holik as he moves to Macquarie University

After serving in AFES at the University of Technology, Sydney (UTS) city campus for about 6 years with Credo, our family has been praying to start up a new ministry challenge at Macquarie University; to reach out to the overseas post-graduate students, to evangelise, train and prepare them to go back home, so they can win their nations for Christ. Our family has been praying for this new harvest field in the last year or so. The campus location is also closer for our family to minister together.

Macquarie University in North Ryde hosts the third largest community of overseas students in Australia which comprises close to 10,000 students and 500+ overseas postgraduate (research) students. On the ground, there exists a group of Indonesian postgraduate research students at Macquarie University. In that fellowship, there are about six young families with a few young children. Most of them are Christians and all of them, upon finishing their studies, will be working at Indonesian government institutions and lecturing at several different universities in Indonesia.

This could be a ministry model of what follows, as it seeks to reach out students from different nationalities and ethnics background. This ministry will include **evangelising, training and preparing** the few studying here to impact many in their home countries, for the glory of God. It will also **support strong link between local and international postgraduate Christian students, lecturers and academics** at Macquarie University and beyond.

Through this network, Christians may be able to encourage one another to be faithful followers of Jesus, being a salt and light to the world in their respective fields, wherever they are. This network will also **challenge overseas Christian academics to be serving God strategically in their home countries.**

I hope you can pray for our decision to move to Macquarie University starting in 2015. It is not an easy one, because UTS and Credo has been the biggest part of our family life in the last six-and-a-half years or so. However, we know that this is what God wanted us to do next.
