Message from Rev Phill Read

If there is one trait that is true of our age it's the quest to discover who we really are. We seek to define our identity and what gives us significance.

What makes it so difficult is that we are told we can be and do anything. So follow your passion.

What if God defined your life and gave it significance?

Easter is where Jesus redeems us from a life of self-determination. More importantly, he gives our life purpose. We now know who we are (children of God who will inherit God's kingdom). Our lives have significance because God is shaping them. He

has given us the Holy Spirit and is transforming us to be like Jesus: truly human. In Christ I bring delight to the Father and will receive His approval on the last day.

Easter sets aside the worries of whether I have done enough with my life. I no longer live with regret about what I did or should have done. Instead I'm thankful for the new start Jesus has given me. I thankful that he shows me who I really am.

PAC Annual General Meeting



Our Annual General Meeting was held on 28 March. Thank you to all who attended and participated.

Rev Phill presented a report on church happenings since he was appointed in December 2020. Rev Phill also provided an update on the Building Committee's plans for the renovations in the kitchen and foyer area.

Our Treasurer, Jeff Powys, presented a budget for the next 12 months. Last year significant updating renovations were conducted at the Dardanelles St property before the Read family moved in. Similarly, the Carrington St property has been repainted, recarpeted and now leased to tenants. Due to these costs and the fact that the Carrington St property was vacant for 2 months, it is anticipated that there will be a budget deficit of \$36,907 this year. Fortunately, there was a surplus of \$26,398 last year to soften the deficit. The budget will be reviewed again in September.

Of note, the building works are funded by monies invested for this purpose. When the plans have been drawn, Rev Phill will present them at church services. He will then call a special meeting of Church Members to vote on the plans.

Parish Council Report

Summary from Parish Council March 10 meeting,

The parish council met on March 10 and our work focused on a number of priorities.

<u>Building project</u>: An overall plan for the kitchen, classroom and foyer area has been presented to parish council. The value of this plan is a professionally completed and multipurpose use of this area of the church which will enhance our community and accommodate the vision of church growth both in membership and spiritual life. A special meeting of church members will be called to showcase the design and to present final costings.

<u>Missions/outreach</u>: The parish council has agreed to the recommendation from the missions/outreach committee, to support Macarthur indigenous churches, Wedderburn Aboriginal Ministry Centre project. Funds will be gifted to purchase a tractor to support the project. Further surplus funds are also being recommended to support African bible college students.

<u>2021 budget:</u> We are thankful to Jeff Powys for his work with the draft budget for 2021. The budget has been passed and we ask you to pray with us for God's continued provision and leading in the implementation of this budget.

<u>Morning tea</u> is back and everyone is excited to share in this time together. Remember to keep Covid safe during these precious community times. We look forward to having lunch in the new kitchen in the not-too-distant future.

Thank you to all who helped at the $\underline{\text{Working Bee}}$. Considerable rubbish was removed. There is always more to be done so wee look forward to the next working bee.
