

## **Covid-Safe Sunday Services**

Two church services are now being run on Sunday mornings:

- ♦ From 9:00am = 10:00am, an English-only service of Holy Communion.
- From 11:00am 12:00pm, a bi-lingual service with Communion served once a month. For families, the children will enjoy Godly Play presented in a Covid-safe manner. We will start together with bi-lingual worship, prayer and news announcements. After the news announcements, the English congregation will go to the hall and the Chinese congregation willremain in the church. Phill and David will each share the Bible and their teaching.

**Booking your seat:** Due to the 2m2 rule for social distancing, our church can only accommodate a limited number of people for each service. We ask for people to **book in through our website for the service you choose.** Please arrive early.

Though not compulsory, some people choose to wear a face mask. If so please bring your own.

A 'live-streaming' of our two services is also available on **YouTube** - 9:00am English-only and 11:00am Chinese-only. Please see our website (**www.penshurstanglican.org**) for further instructions.

## Register at the foyer

To maintain the Covid-Safe procedures, people entering and leaving the church buildings at any time are required to check in and check out using the QR code displayed on each glass door at the foyer entrance.

This will help us to keep a record on who was at the church and when. If there is an outbreak, the NSW health department is then able to contact those peoplewho were at the church.

## **PAC Annual General Meeting**


Our Church **Annual General Meeting** will be held in the Church on **Sunday 28 March at 1:30pm**. It is important that all members of our Church participate. During the meeting we will be receiving reports from the Ministry Team: Rev Phill and Pastor Tiny, our Treasurer, Jeff Powys, the Wardens and the Building Committee. They will update us on what has happened in our Church over the last 8 months. Jeff Powys will present a budget for the next 12 months and the Building Committee will present their plans for the next stage of works.

After this we will need to elect 2 wardens and at least 3 Parish Councillors. We also need to appoint an auditor and some Nominators. The Wardens are responsible for the financial and property aspects of the Church. They look after the buildings and the church houses. Parish Councillors work with the Wardens to look after the Church. They assist in making decisions about spending money, fixing salaries, employing people to assist the Ministers, running events and other matters as they come up.

Our Wardens are currently Geoff Scrimes, Michael Lin and Hua (Nancy) Feng. The Parish Councillors are Merilyn Mayhew, Gaye Bishop and Suzy (Yan) Zhou. Michael is stepping down so we will need to elect at least two new wardens.

It is really important that we have representatives from both the English and the Mandarin congregations on Parish Council as either Wardens and Councillors. We encourage the young adults to consider standing. Michael has done a great job the last 3 years. This is the decision making body for our Church and it should reflect who we are as a church body. You do not need any special qualifications to participate.
