

A Word from Rev. Phill

Challenging times

When I make phone calls, the general tone I hear is anxiety. How long will we be in lockdown? How great is the danger to us? What happens if there is a new strain of the virus?

Unfortunately, I cannot answer these questions, but we know that anxiety is something that many Christians have experienced throughout the ages. In such times, they have found comfort in the Christian hope. Michael Perry's hymn 'He Lives in Us' resonates with the words of Romans 8:31-39, speaking to issues of human frailty, God's boundless power and our need for hope now.

He Lives In Us

He lives in us the Christ of God, His Spirit joins with ours He brings to us the Father's grace with powers beyond our powers And if enticing sin grows strong when human nature fails God's Spirit in our inner self fights with us and prevails

Our pangs of guilt and fears of death are Satan's stratagems -By Jesus Christ who died for us God pardons who condemns And when we cannot feel our faith not bring ourselves to pray The Spirit pleads with God for us in words we could not say

God gave His Son to save us all - no greater love is known And shall that love abandon us who have become Christ's own For God has raised Him from the grave in this we stand assured So none can tear us from the love of Jesus Christ our Lord

Macarthur Indigenous Church

Each year the Macarthur Indigenous Church make a painting for NAIDOC week. This year's painting is full of meaning for their church, the theme was Healing for the country.

The painting below has many elements as explained by Mark Manton:

- The red background on a map of Australia represents the bloodshed of the massacres of Aboriginal people all over Australia.
- ➤ In the centre is a cross made up of boomerangs. The reason why is that our boomerangs were the source of our food, our provisions, our protection for our families. Likewise when I see the message of Jesus Christ and his death and resurrection we see that he is our source of provision, protection, our healing.
- ➤ There is blood splatter, red paint there, reminding us that Jesus was nailed to the cross so that through his blood comes our healing and our hope all wrapped up in what he completed on the cross.

Parish council are very mindful of all of you in lockdown and are praying for you to know Jesus' strength, patience and provision.



Church Finances

As you might expect this has been a bumpy year for the Church's finances. \$20,000 With Rev. Phill moving into the Dardenelles Street property and Pastor

Bart moving out of the Carrington Street property, we went without rental \$15,000 income for several months.

We also needed to complete repairs on both properties to make them more comfortable to live in before the Reads and the tenants moved in. Unfortunately, not much maintenance had been completed since they were built.

The cost of the maintenance and repairs was greater than originally budgeted for. In addition the Covid 19 restrictions means that the Hall and church use and rental is also reduced.

Church members have been faithful in their giving. We have met the Offertory budget which is good news. We need to do this, as we had budgeted to make a loss overall this year. The loss was going to be greater than our reserves on hand from last year.

With the risk of further lockdowns threatening our income.

We need to be in prayer that our situation does not deteriorate further.

Cell Groups at PAC
