## 'Covid-Safe' Sunday Services

Two new church services are now being run on Sunday mornings:

- ◆ From **9:00am - 10:00am**, *an English-only* service of Holy Communion.
- ◆ From **11:00am - 12:00pm**, *a bi-lingual* service with Communion served once a month. For families, the children will enjoy Godly Play presented in a Covid-safe manner. We will start with bi-lingual worship, prayer and news announcements together. After the news announcements, the English congregation will go to the hall and the Chinese congregation will remain in the church. Phill and David will each share the Bible and their teaching.

**Booking your seat:** Due to 2m2 rule for social distancing, our church can only accommodate a limited number of people for each service. To control numbers and ensure contact tracing **everyone must 'book' their seat in advance for the service you choose.** Please arrive early.

**\*\*We highly recommend wearing FACE MASK in church.**

**Please bring your own face mask.**

## Register at the foyer

## February Parish Council Meeting

Parish Council met this Monday and are continuing to look at church staffing levels, and to develop a unified plan for the kitchen and foyer. We have been advised that before we begin any new work, we need a compliance audit to check the building work to date meets all relevant codes and regulations. We have engaged a compliance auditor.

We discussed the draft budget for 2021 with Treasurer Jeff Powys. 2020 was such an unusual year, and 2021 is full of uncertainties, so we need to base our budget on 2019 figures and make a number of assumptions. We ask you to pray with us for God's provision and leading.

Bart and Kim's house is almost ready to be rented out. Parish Council has appointed JW Realty to manage the rental.

Many of the church's systems lapsed during lockdown. Now we are back, and working on putting rosters and processes back in place. We hope to start a Covid-safe morning tea on 21 February.
